Introduction

During the fourth block, the Clio General Survey was released to all Clio Members via email, the Facebook group and newsletter – this way it was ensured that the survey would reach as many members as possible, both active members as well as regular members.

The goal of this survey was to evaluate several aspects within Clio with regard to a variety of issues. It focuses on several sections, which are listed here below:

- General Clio
- Events and Services
- Clio Social Activities
- Yearbook
- Clio Services
- Bookstore
- Checks and Balances
- Conference
- Summaries and Study Support
- Awareness
- Members Initiative Portal
- Clio Board

All essay question answers have deliberately been unedited in order to present the purest results, we therefore acknowledge that there are spelling, typing and grammar mistakes in these answers.

As this survey is very elaborate, there will be a brief verdict that constitutes the Board's interpretation and response to the results of every different section. These verdicts can be found on the next page.

Verdict General Clio and Non-Active Members:

In sum, 64 people participated in answering these survey question of which 34 were active members at that time and 26 were not. Additionally, four people have been active members but were not at the time of filling in the survey. Out of the 64 people, there were 25 first year students, 27 second year students, eight third year students, two fourth year students, one pre-master student and one master student.

The answers to the questions of this first section teach us the following things:

- Clio should focus more on its inclusiveness and non-active members.
- There is a desire for more social events that are more inclusive in nature.
- Generally, the Masters activities are strictly organized for Master students. It is therefore advised to keep certain events restricted to Master students only.
- Generally, the human of IR section of the newsletter adds to the incentive to read it.

The 31st Clio Board separated the activities that are exclusively for active members from follow-up events. For example, the running dinner will be a separate activity, followed by a pub-crawl which will be open for everyone to attend. Moreover, the Board will have several Clio Drinks, occasionally these will be combined with another event such as an the Photo Vernissage but which could also be combined with for example a board-game evening. Activities such as these will lower the barrier for non-active members to participate, as people will be more likely to attend individually rather than with their whole committee. In order to lower the barrier of members to visit the Board, the name of the 'Clio Office' has been changed into the 'Clio Attic'. The Board hopes that the change in the name will give the members a feeling that it is not just a formal and exclusive place but also a place where they can come to relax and play games. Additionally, the Board got an air-hockey table, which has already proven to attract people to come to the Clio Attic. Regarding the Newsletter, the Human of IR section appeared to be popular according to the survey. As an addition, the newsletter will ask IRIO teachers to contribute to this section. This year, the section with 'Fact of the Week' has been replaced by the 'The Clio Column' which has a more entertaining approach to things that happen within Clio or amongst the Clio Board members.

Verdict Events and Services:

Out of the 64 respondents for this section, most people indicated that they visited social activities the most. The proposals for new activities were diverse, although the idea of a vrijmibo/informal drink was mentioned various times. This has been adopted in the Board's policy, as various informal drinks will be held.

Most people indicate that they find Clio helpful for orientation for after their studies, but there is room for improvement. Talking to alumni and people in the field was mentioned often as an interesting improvement. The Board will look into the possibilities of setting up a better Alumni Mentor System together with Mitrany. Also, there will be an improved Career platform, where the "Life after IR" section is supposed to give a better impression of possibilities after IR. Furthermore, it was mentioned that the visibility of the Career services could be improved. Reasons for not visiting the Career events was mostly a lack of time. This has been taken into account with scheduling the events.

Verdict Social Activities:

The questions on the Clio social activities were answered by around 60 people. The questions mainly were concerning the Clio parties. The Clio parties were on average rated

with a 7. The critique delivered on the parties mostly focused on the location, the inclusiveness and the music of the parties. A change of location was mentioned often, for example a lot of people enjoyed the external parties. Taking this into account the Board has been looking to cooperate with other associations to organise another external party not taking place at Pakhuis. Next to this, the travel announcement party will take place at a different location. To increase the inclusiveness of the parties, the Board has decided to move the Active Member Appreciation Day to a different day so it will not take place before the Travel Announcement Party. Furthermore, having more inclusive pre-drinks will be promoted among members. The music at the parties was mostly received positively, most of the critique was directed towards the DJ's personal taste in music. It has been arranged with the DJ to minimise this to the last half an hour of the party. Lastly it was asked what other social activities people would like to see Clio do. The most frequent responses were: informal drinks and sport activities. Informal drinks have been established for upcoming year, starting after the first block. The idea of having more sport activities is possible to establish within the event committee, since they have two open activities this year. The idea of a movie night was also initiated a few times. As a result, amongst other reasons, an extra Watch & Learn event has been established.

Verdict Clio Yearbook:

The survey showed that people are generally quite satisfied with the quality of the Clio Yearbook. From the comments made on the content of the Yearbook, we can conclude that the yearbook should include more non-active members, and the biggest part of the content should be devoted to reflecting on the year Clio had, rather than having filler content unrelated to IRIO and Clio. On the basis of the comments made in the survey and in order to comply with GDPR, the yearbook will refrain from putting any of the members' data in the yearbook, including names.

Verdict Clio Services:

The questions on the Clio services were answered by 64 people. Most people found the website structured and clear, but still some services were unknown. The biggest points of critique were the internship database, the master portal and the Clio card. There will be an improved and new Career platform which will provide a more prominent place to the internship database, in order to increase its visibility. The master portal will be maintained by the Secretary and the Master portal Manager, who will together try to improve the clarity and the visibility of the portal. Furthermore, the services available under the Clio card/sticker will be updated. The Commissioner of Corporate Relations has been working on adding more partnerships to the Clio Sticker, which makes it more attractive for both companies and members. The partnerships will be promoted both on the website as well as on the facebook and newsletter to make sure the members are aware of which services they can get with the Clio sticker. The majority of the people indicated not to be interested in a Clio clothing line. Among the people that were interested, a sweater or hoodie was the most popular response. The Board has decided not to launch a Clio clothing line given the lack of interest. However, a new partnership has led to the decision to sell Clio mugs, which will be sold for a lower price because of the partnership.

Verdict Bookstore:

The questions regarding the Bookstore were answered by 63 people. The average grade that has been given to the Bookstore services is a 6,5. Most people are aware that it is not Clio delivering the books but the StudyStore. Almost all the complaints are either related to the delivery times or the prices. It is for this reason that students, mainly second year or

older, decide to order their books elsewhere. Examples of this are Amazon or secondhand from peers. To increase the satisfaction of the members regarding the Clio Bookstore, close contact is maintained between Clio and the StudyStore. The StudyStore has given quick responses regarding delivery times, which is why the cooperation is not deemed insufficient by the Board. However, the cooperation will be evaluated with reference to the outcome of the survey at the end of each block.

Verdict Checks and Balances:

Most of the surveyed people perceive printed editions of Checks and Balances positively. The biggest part claimed that they've read 4-6 articles in the past year, which is why the committee is going to focus on increased visibility of online articles of Checks and Balances. The articles read were described as thoroughly researched. The Facebook page and the website of Checks and Balances, however, could use more attention, as most of the surveyed answered that they never visit it.

Basing on advice from the surveyed, the Checks will proceed to focus more on improving the layout, the promotion of the magazine, and the online presence.

Verdict Clio Conference:

The questions regarding the Conference were answered by 64 people. Out of this group, 25 students visited the Conference. The visitors of the Conference all rated the Conference with a sufficient grade resulting in an average of a 8,2. Generally, the improvements referred to the master of ceremonies, the timeframe of the day, and the interactiveness of the day. The location of the Conference was well-received. One person out of the 39 that did not attend did not hear about the Conference, which makes it seem like there was sufficient promotion. The Conference committee of this year is already working on finding a suitable location, master of ceremonies and will critically review the time-frame of the day in order to improve the previous conference.

Verdict Summaries and Study Support:

The questions on the summaries and study support were answered by 63 people, the essay question had 11 responses. The summaries and the masterclasses were very well received. For this reason, Clio will continue providing these. Some critique was given towards the quality of the summaries. This year SlimStuderen stopped writing summaries, Clio switched their partnership with Athena Studies and increased the reward for the summaries. As a result, the Board hopes the quality of the summaries and masterclasses will increase. Moreover, a majority of the answers expressed that they would prefer summaries that are more concrete. Therefore, a new guideline for the summaries will be established, where the summary is written as text but the extra important stuff is highlighted in bold. Lastly, the survey showed that the study weeks were not as much appreciated as the study groups. This year there will only be study groups, and no more study weeks.

Verdict Awareness Group:

Out of 63 respondents, 11 were totally unaware of the existence of the Awareness Group while out of 60 respondents only two respondents did not like the concept of the Awareness Group. Generally, tips regarding the improvement of the Awareness Group referred to increasing its visibility, increasing the budget, making it a committee and making it a full-year initiative. This year, the Awareness Group has been changed into an Awareness committee as it will get a Board Premium of €100 for each semester. In this way, the committee will have more means to

make the events a bit more extensive. The set-up of the Awareness committee will remain the same with being divided into two semesters. In this way, the inclusivity of applying for the committee increases as also students that have been abroad or have been doing an internship still have the opportunity to become an active Clio-member.

Verdict Members Initiative Portal:

The majority of the respondents was unaware of the initiatives in the Members Initiatives Portal (MIP). Nevertheless, a big part indicated that they could potentially be interested in joining them. 50% of the people said that they were, or could be, interested in posing an initiative. The answers to how the MIP could be improved focused mostly on visibility. The Board will improve the visibility by promoting new initiatives more in the newsletter.

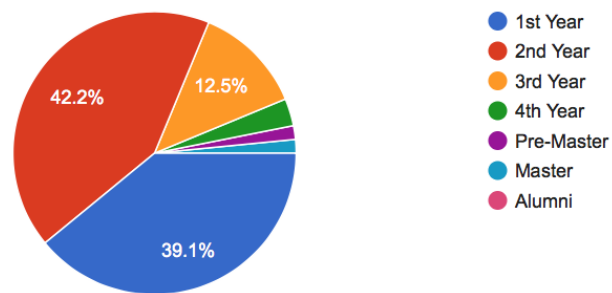
Verdict Clio Board:

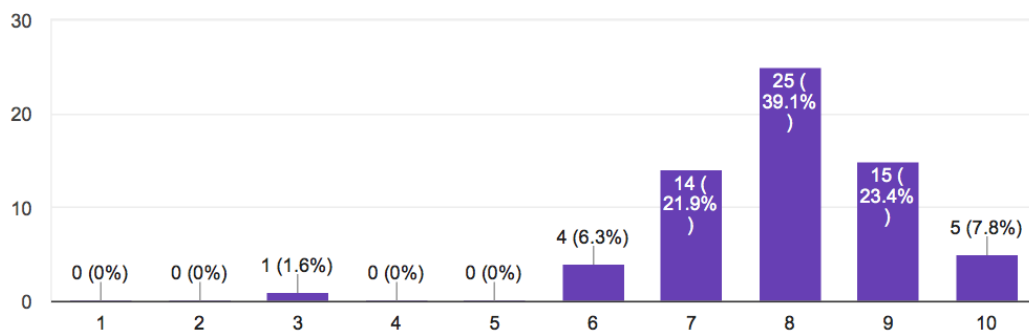
What year are you in?

What rating would you give Clio as a study association (1 till 10)?

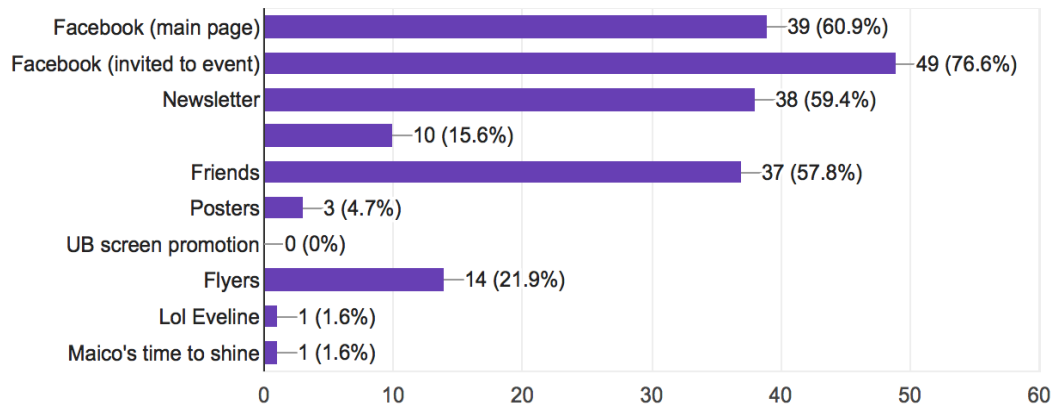

I generally learn about Clio events via:

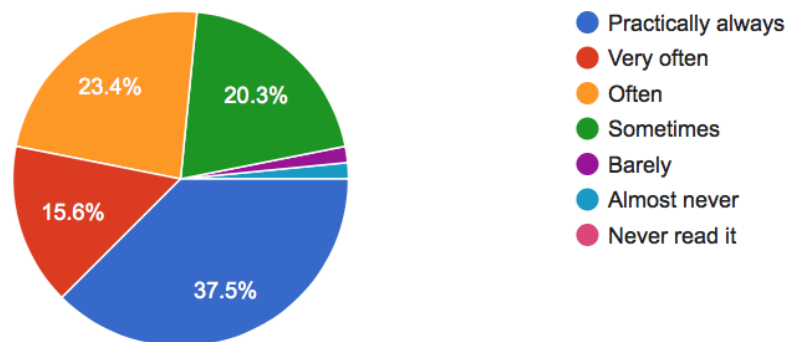

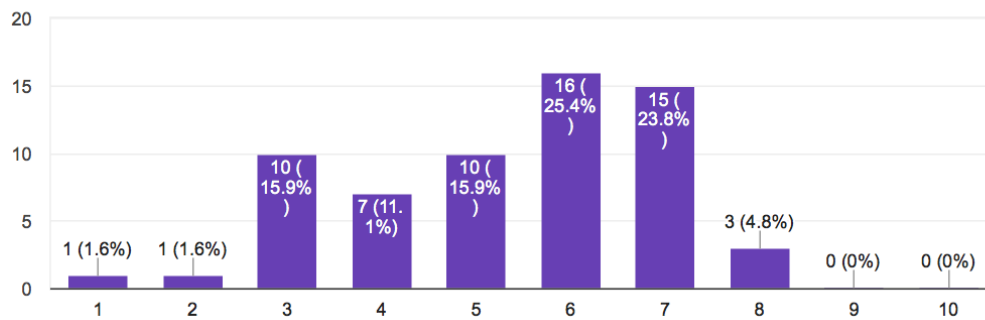
Do you read Clio's newsletter?

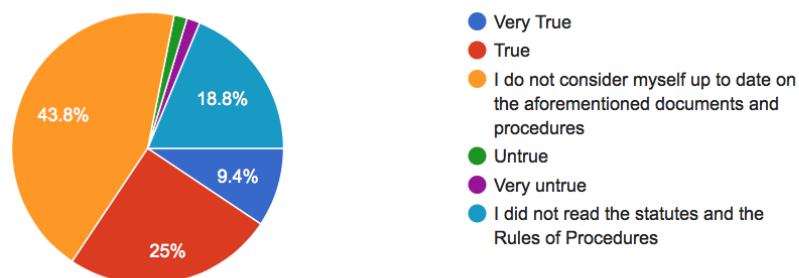
How inclusive do you feel Clio is to its non-active members?

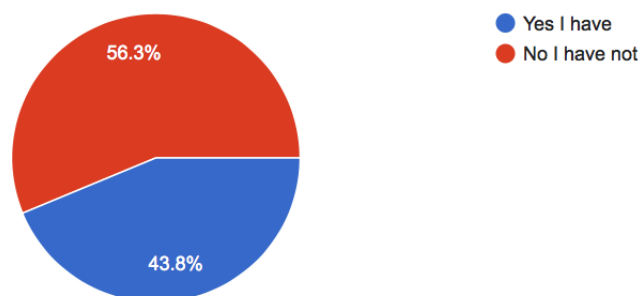
Having read the statutes, the Rules of Procedure and knowing about the General Members Meetings being the highest organ of the association - I do consider Clio to be a democratic association:

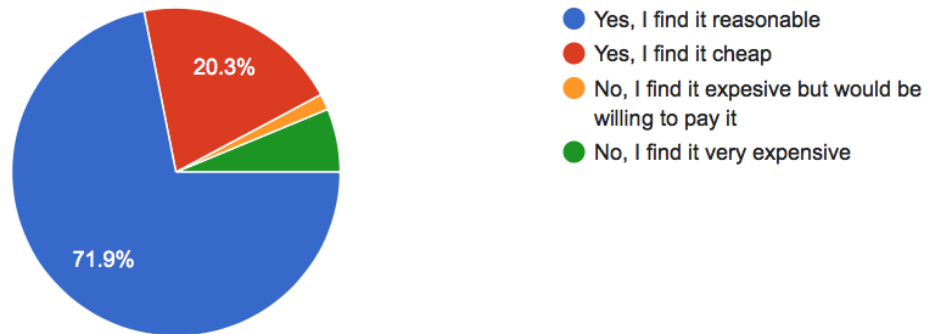
Have you ever attended a Clio General Members Meeting ?

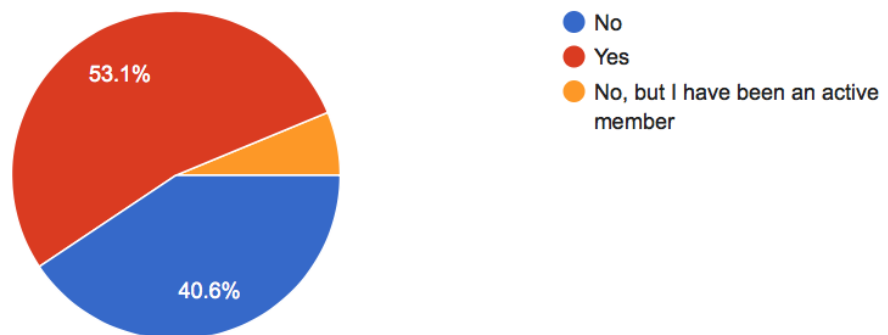
Are you satisfied with the membership fee of 17 euro?

I think this would be a motivation for some students to read the newsletter more often.

3. How do you think Clio could increase feelings of inclusion towards non-active members? (42 responses):

- I think Clio does already a pretty good job
- Perhaps by making more spots available for some of the social events or travels and by organising more events in cooperation with the university or other organisations. In any case, you're already doing a really good job!
- Have more events where you to talk to people, e.g. borrels, and where you feel welcome as a non-active member
- No clue. Also, miss me with that democracy shite, when did Clio become a state? You're an association, democracy is not applicable here, no matter how hard DAG tries to make it so.
- Approach them directly

- Disastrous is of course the Active Members Appreciation Dinner on the evening of the party: you already start the evening with the feeling that you do not belong to a group when at 23:45 everyone is still at some exclusive party that you were not invited to. Rather than 'rewarding' active members by excluding non-active members from a activity that you organise for active members, you should try to combine parties with an open activity for non-members (even if active members also participate in that activity). Otherwise, you could propose that board members also invite non-active members to the pre-drinks at their party. Another way of involving non-active Clio members is by re-integrating the dispueten into Clio or make it possible to form year clubs in the Clio structure, so that you also have a non-formal (i.e. through committee involvement etc.) way of being involved in Clio. However, that goes against the vision that the 'reason for us meeting up is because of our studies, not because of social activities' that I heard of some active members - which is for me complete bullshit. Weekly drinks/movie nights/etc. might also help. I will think about more stuff. I do recognise that it's not so much a matter of unwillingness of the board and active members, but just a situation that exists where inclusiveness disappears. The rejection from committees is also often felt as a rejection from the social aspect of Clio - and I do feel that there is no way for you and your friends to be involved in Clio if your not a committee already.

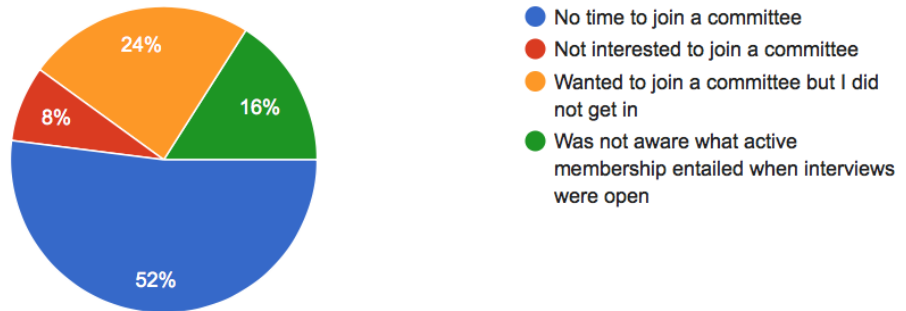

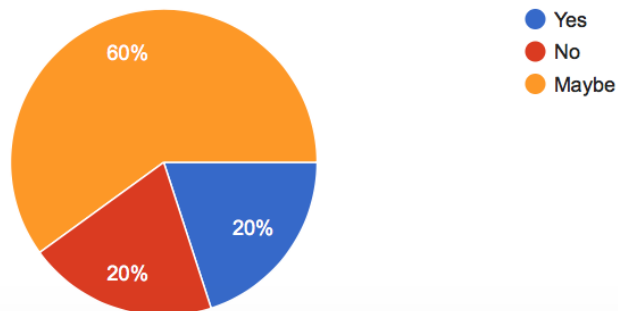
Why are you not an active member?

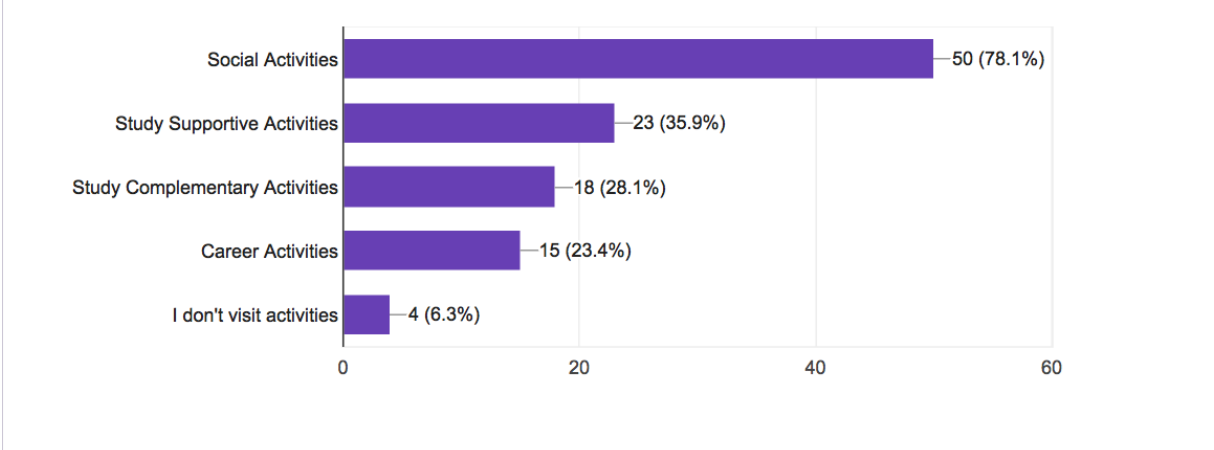
1. If you as a non-active member have any remarks for us, please note them here (don't shy away from being critical :) (10 responses):

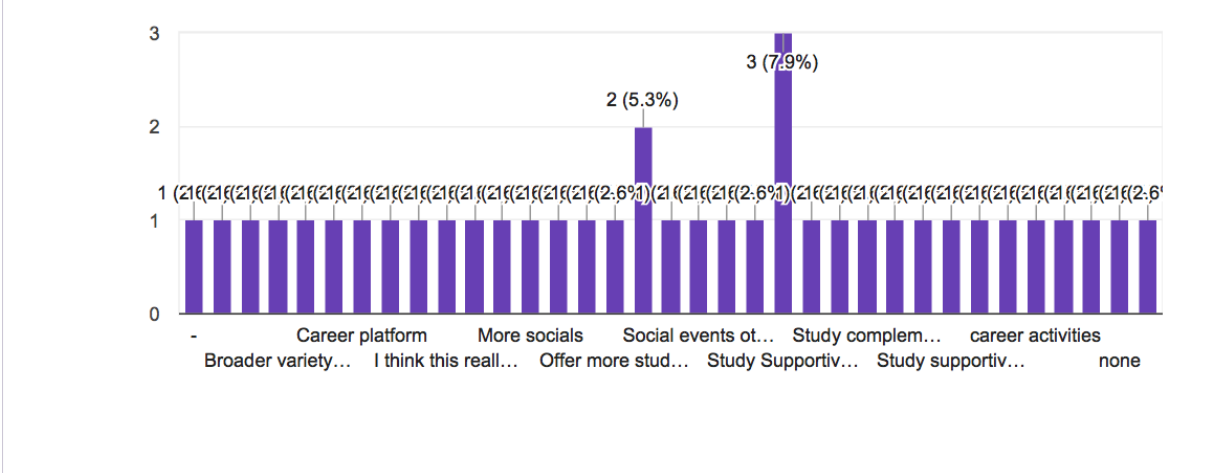

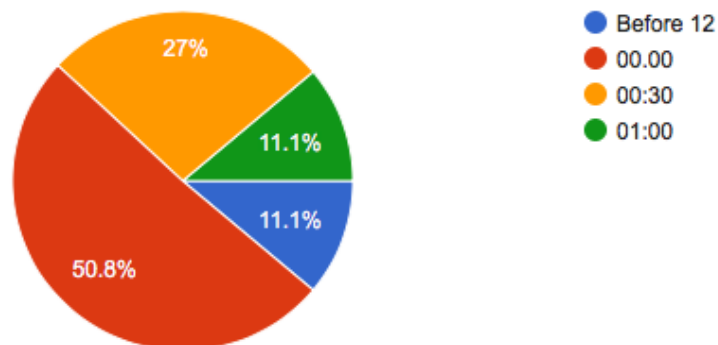
How would you rate Clio parties?

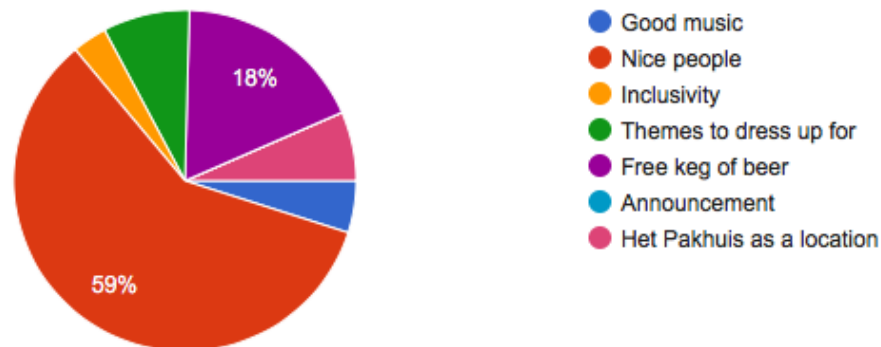
What do you find the most appropriate time for the announcement of the evening? (e.g. Travel Destination Announcement, Conference Announcement)

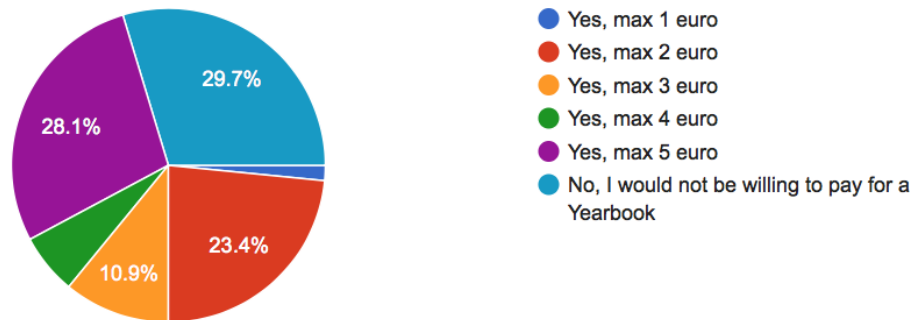
How do you rate the quality of previous Yearbooks?

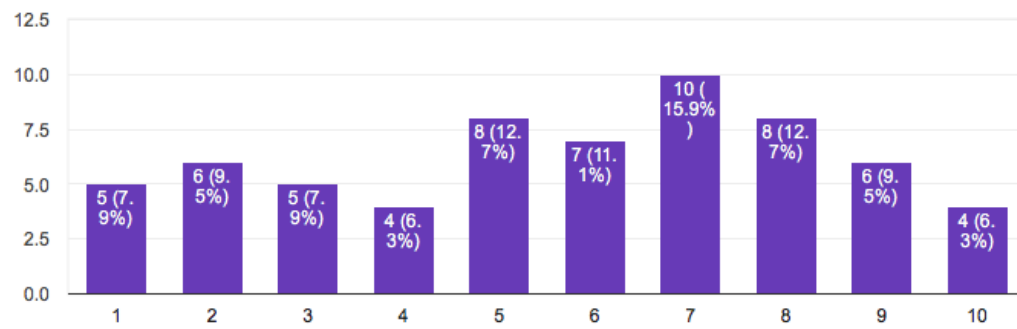
In which years did you use the Clio Bookstore?

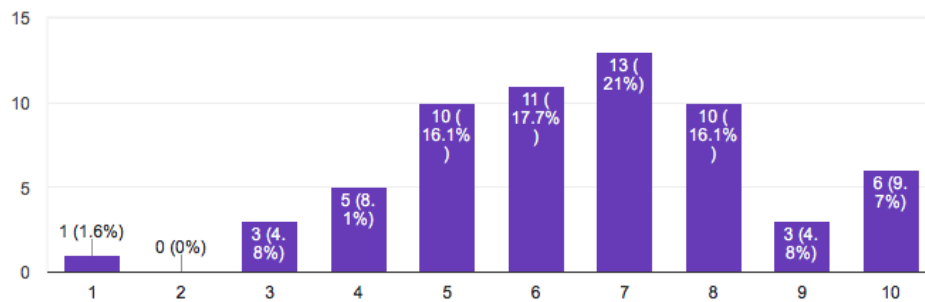
How satisfied are you with the delivery times of the Bookstore?

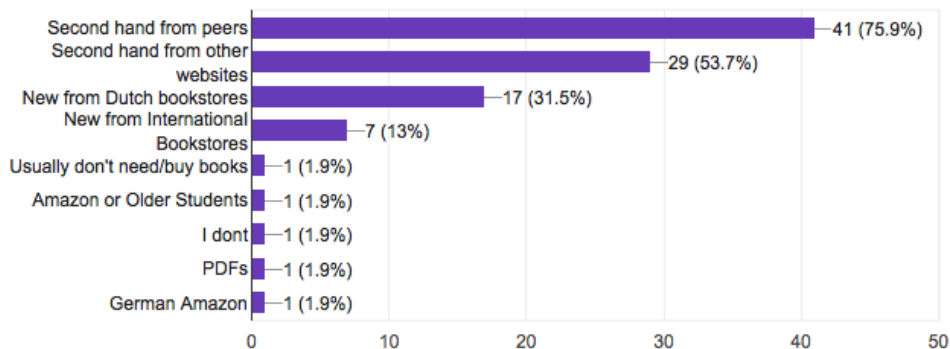
How satisfied are you with the discount you have received on your study books?

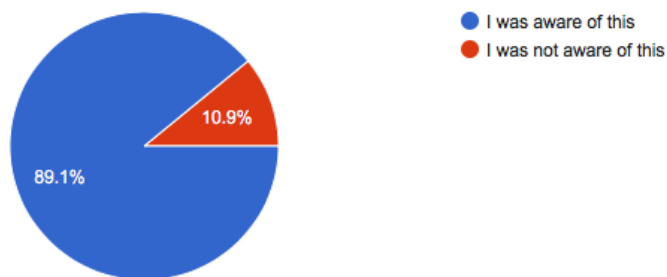

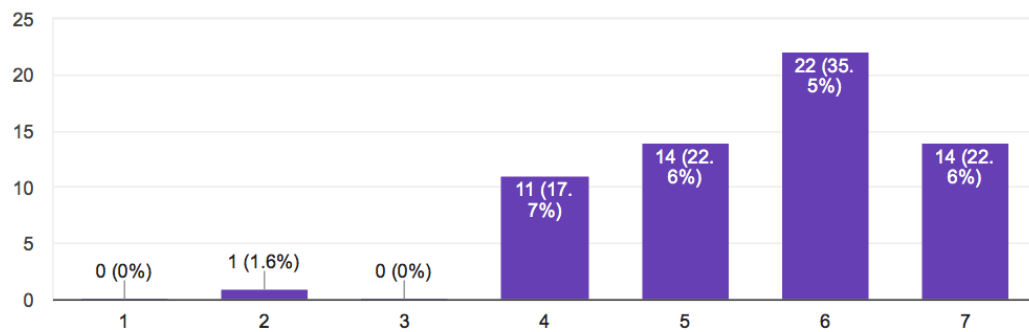
- I've had some issues with delivery
- They seriously need to step up their delivery. My delivery date was postponed 4 times.
- Maybe a lay-out that is not linked to Clio
- If you order early, it's great! If you order late, not so much
- Well it takes often too long
- So definitely not worth it. Books there are still too expensive when you can usually get them on other websites or from older years cheaper, nothing has ever come on time. Most of my friends don't use it now since it's far too unreliable
- The books become available way too late, only a few days before classes start. And the e-mail reminder you can set to receive an e-mail when they become available also doesn't always work. Once the books are on the site though and you order them, you get them really quickly.

- The delivery times should be more accurate. One time I ordered a book and the delivery time was given 2-3 days. Then it was postponed several times. I understand that it might have been because of the large order number suddenly. But they should have sufficient amount of books in the warehouse, as the demand for certain books is predictable.
- Fast refunding
- Change supplier cuz this one is horrible, my books are always late and it messes up my study
- Often you can get the books cheaper at other websites
- sometimes it is annoying that books are out of stock
- The bookstore is too expensive even with the discount, in most cases amazon is a better option
- I always order my books early, so I don't have a problem with the delivery times. However, I do think it is really stupid that a lot of people get their books late.

- It's really annoying that the delivery time differs so much
- The discounts are in the end not much as the books can be bought new on Amazon for the same price as the supposed discount. Plus then delivery times are secured.
- It has amazed me that it took them a few weeks to deliver certain books. As far as I'm concerned the Bookstore must be aware of how many students are taking that specific subject so they now how big their stocks must be.
- Delivery on time is crucial for students, and the discount is sometimes worthless because of the delivery fee of almost 3€, which I find too much.
- even with the discount, new book somewhere else (e.g. amazon) are still cheaper
- I can almost always find cheaper alternatives (even bought new) online
- Find a substitute for the study store, the deal is just plain bad for clio members, with the unexpected long waiting times and prices that are sometimes higher than buying it at a regular store.

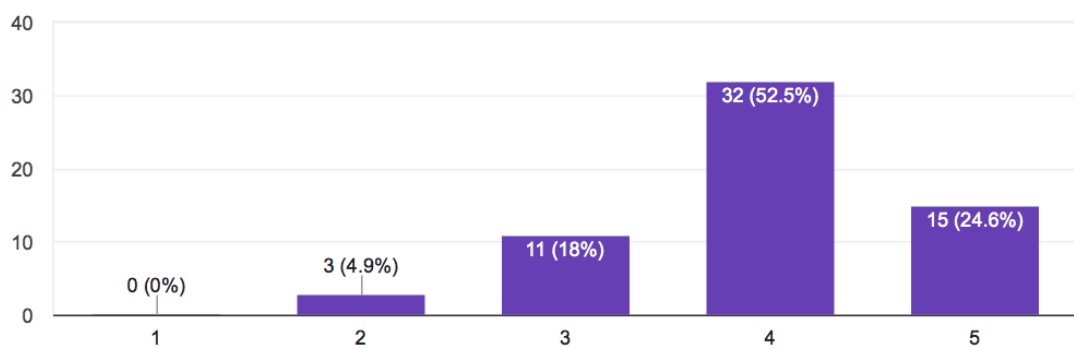

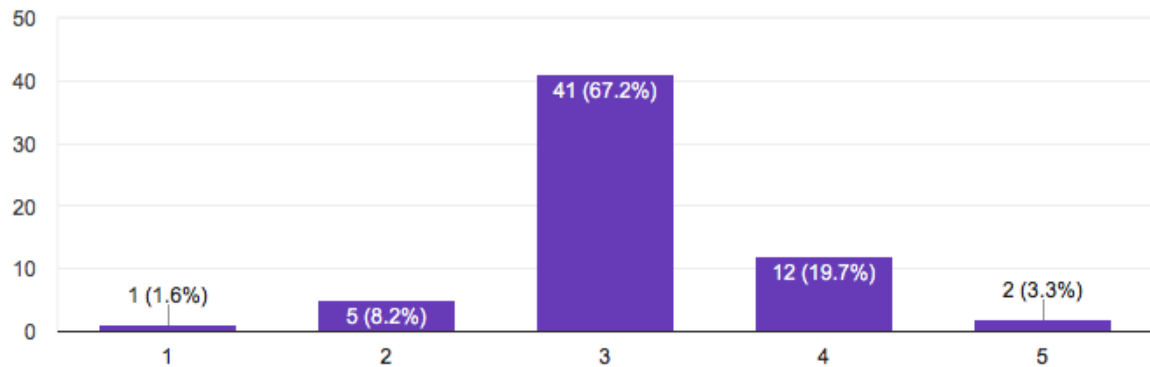

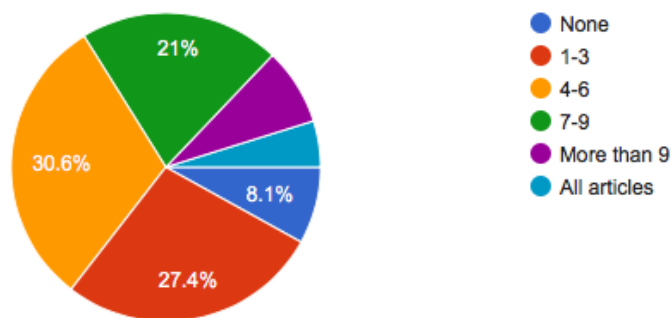

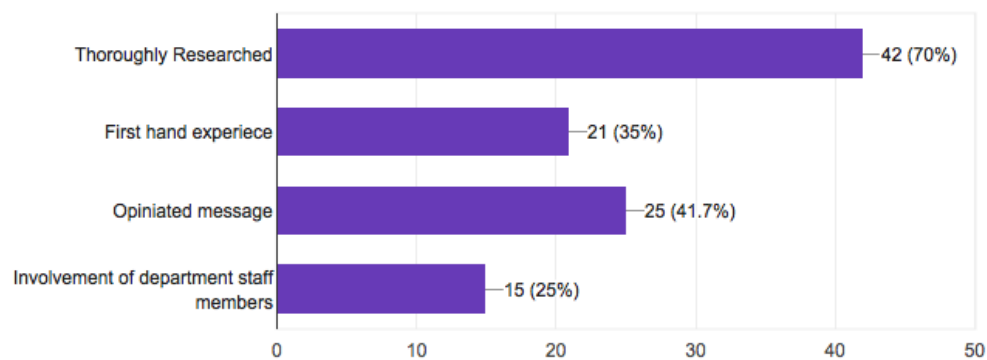
How many full articles did you read this year? (Both digital and print count)

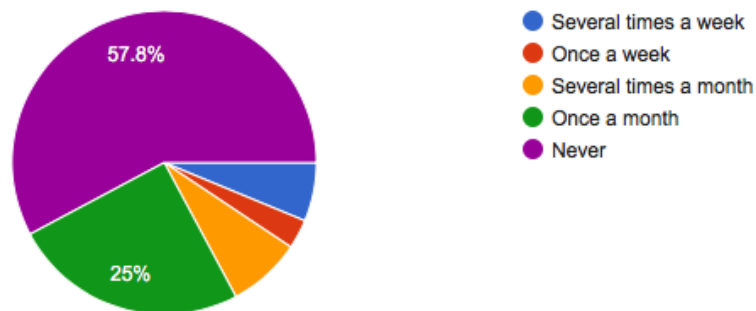
What makes a good Checks article:

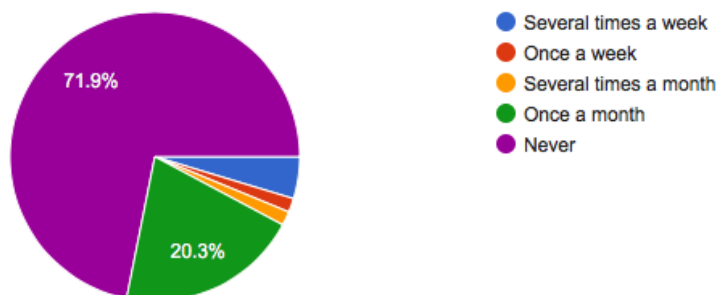
How often do you visit the Facebook page of Checks & Balances?

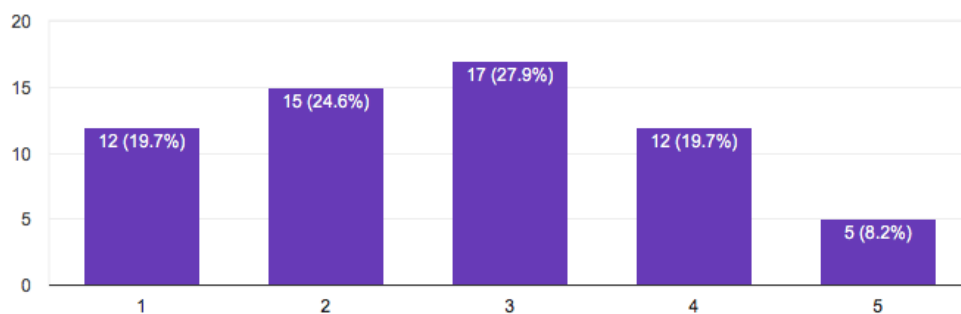
How often do you visit the Website of Checks & Balances?

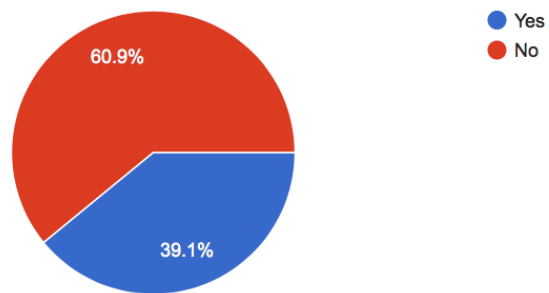

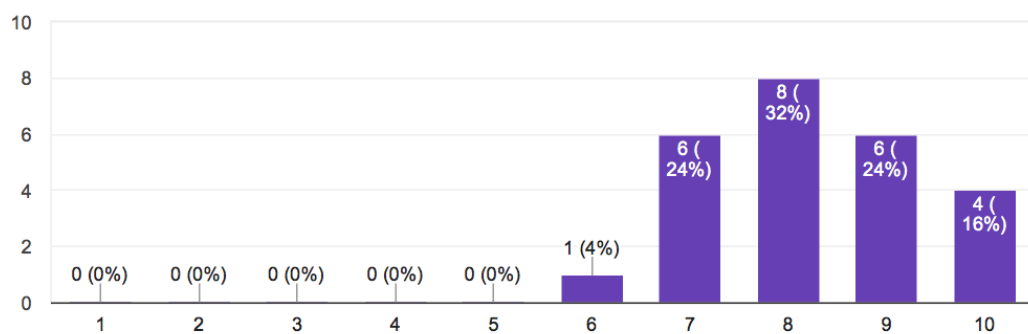

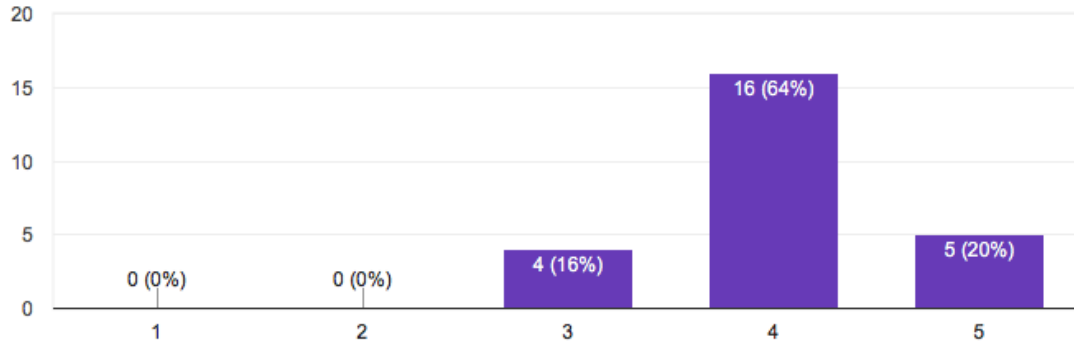
Please rate the Conference overall, from 1-10

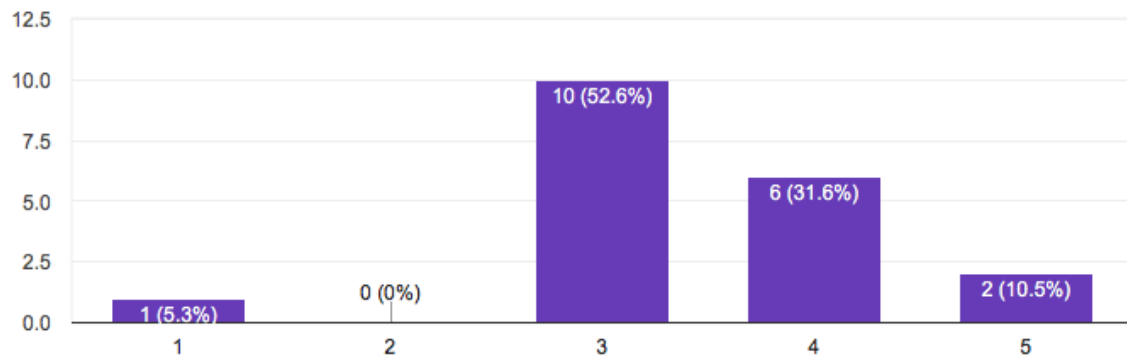

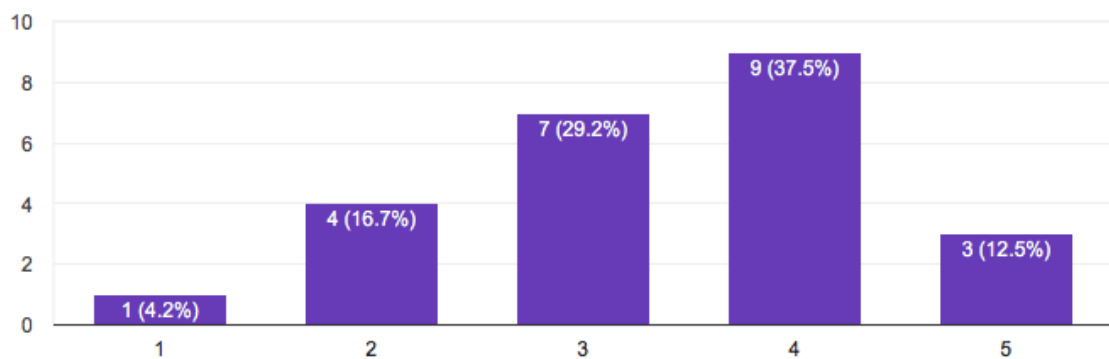

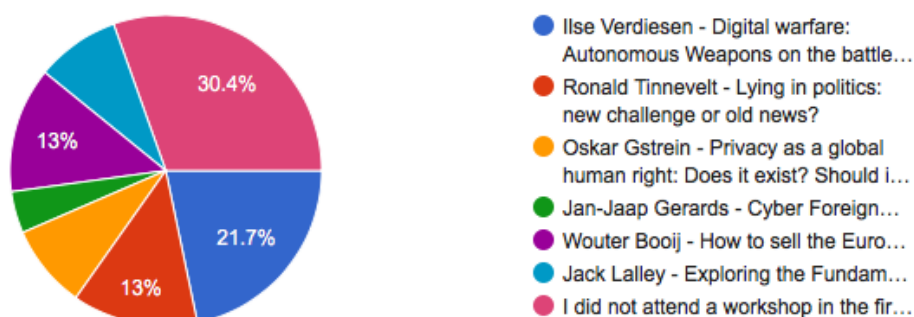

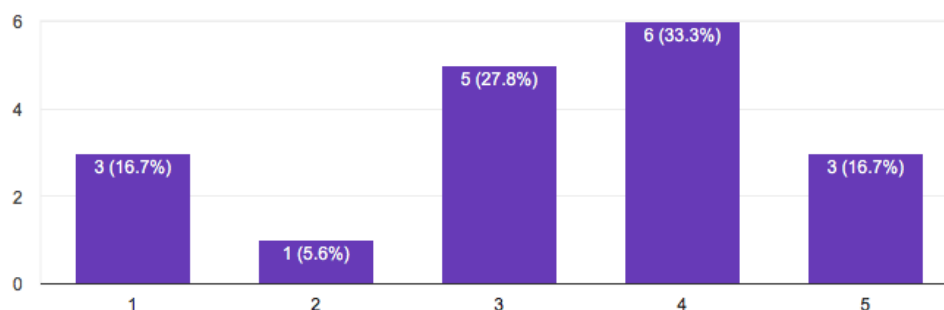

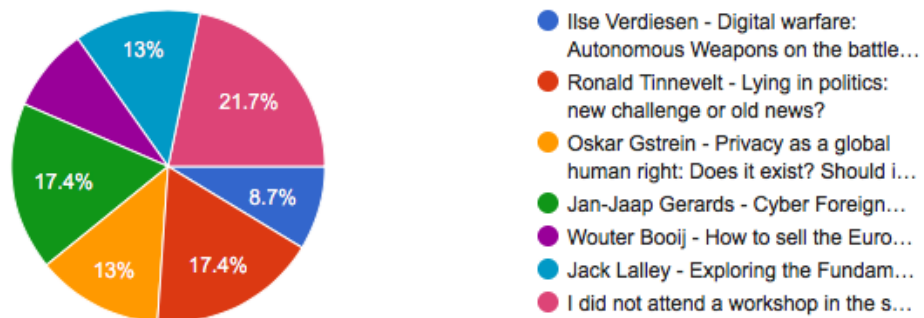

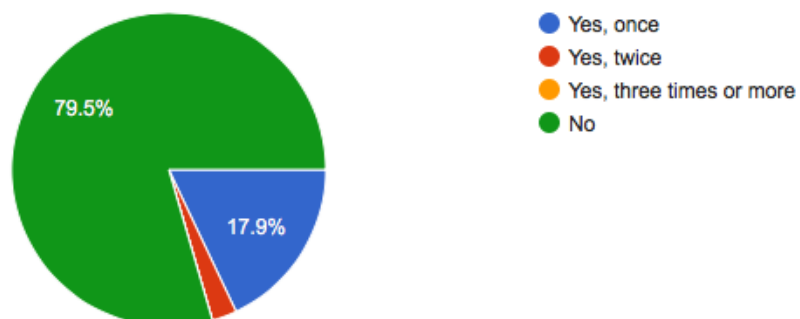
Why did you not visit the Conference?

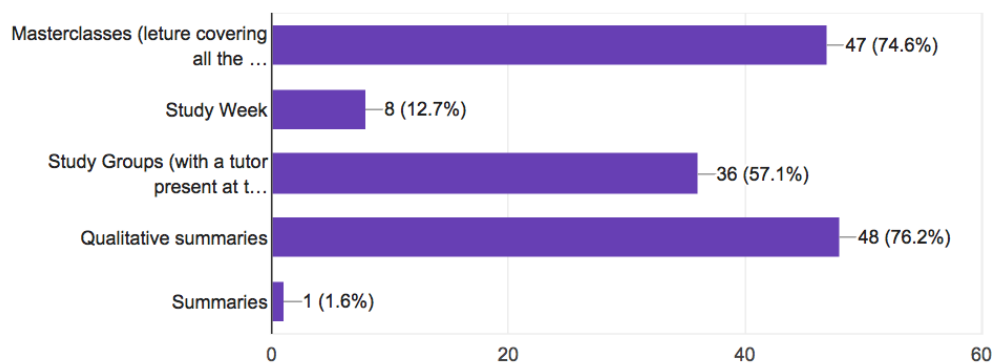

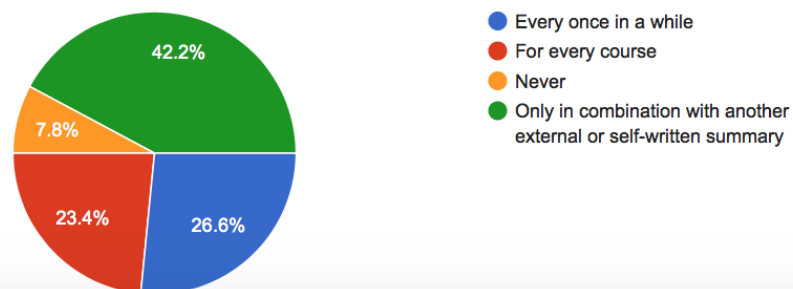
How can Clio best help you to pass your courses?

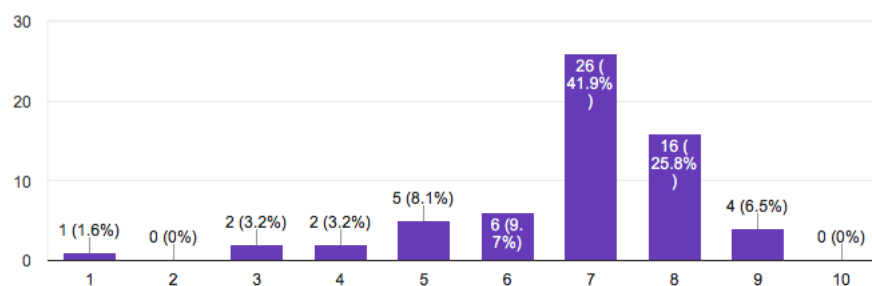
How often do you use Clio summaries?

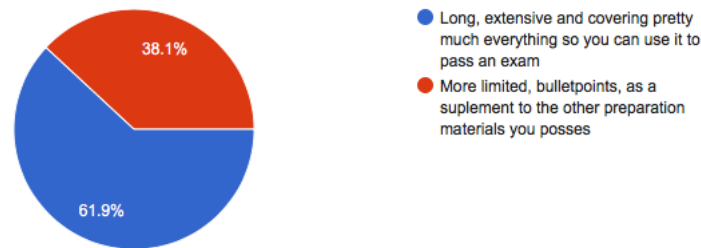
How would you rate the quality of the summaries?

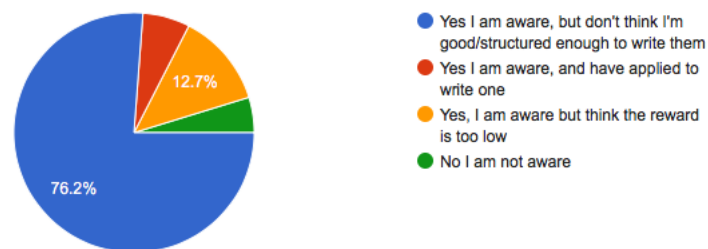
How do you prefer Clio summaries:

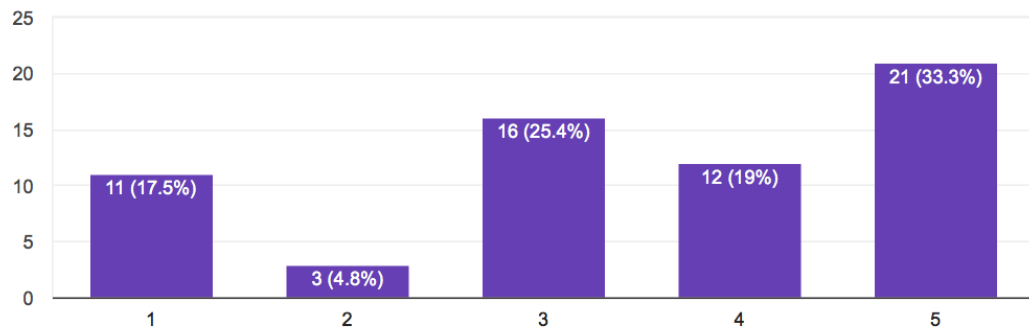
With regards to the summaries and study support, do you have any recommendations? (11 responses)

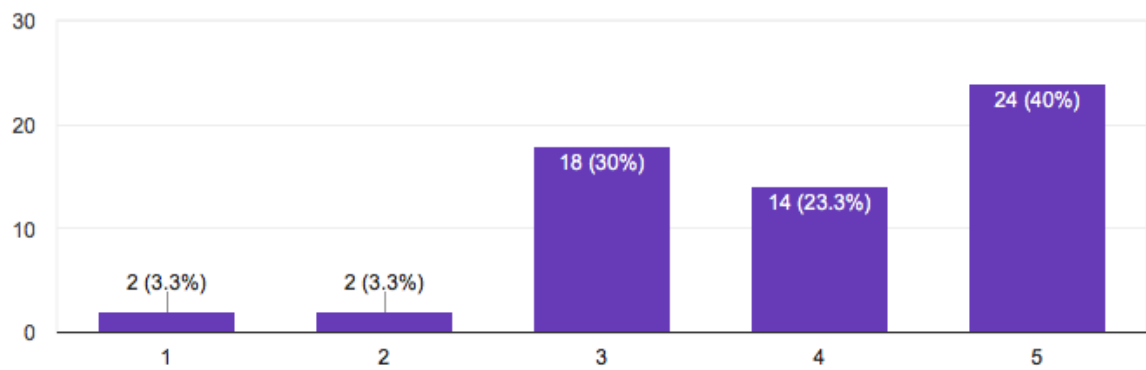

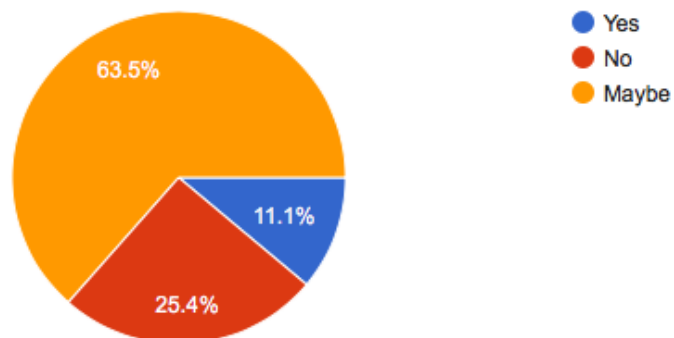

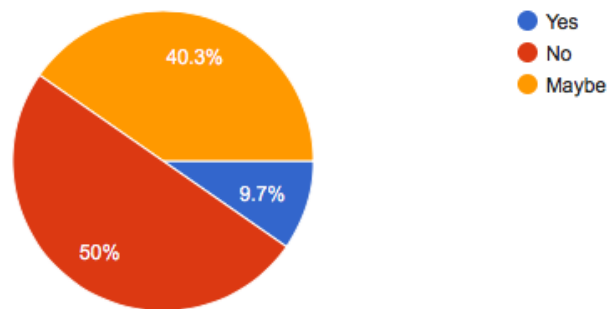

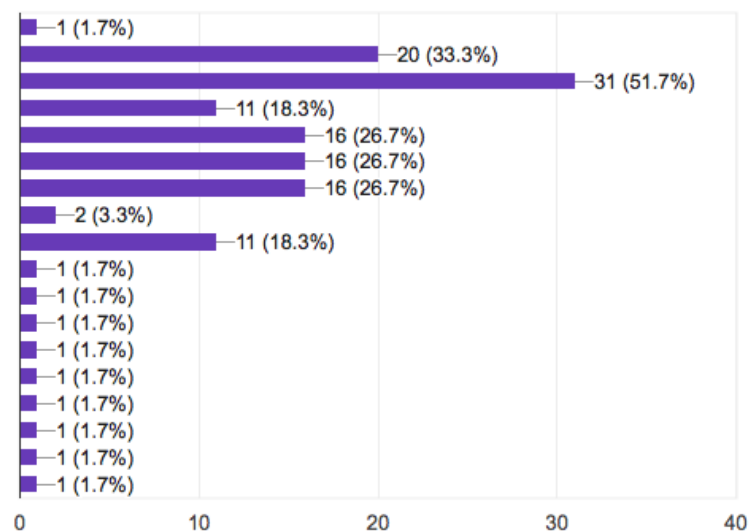
