Introduction

After the first block, the freshmen survey was sent out to all the freshmen that are a member of Clio. The aim of the survey was to get feedback on the activities and services provided by Clio throughout the first block of the year. The survey consisted out of two sections:

- Becoming A Member of Clio
- The ClioWelcome period

All results can be found below, with the open questions completely unedited. As the survey was quite elaborate, you can find a summarised verdict of the result in the following. The full survey was filled in by 30 respondents.

Verdict Becoming A Member of Clio

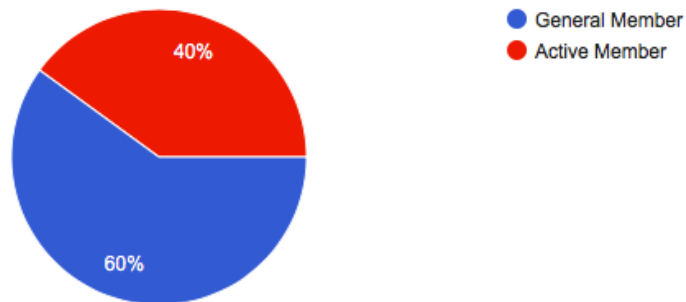
This section was filled in by all 30 respondents with the exception of the open question about the bookstore, which was filled in by only 22 respondents. 40% of the respondents became an active member, while the other 60% is a general member. Most of the respondents found out about Clio via either the RUG website or the Clio website, however to about 40% it was still very vague what Clio is about. We have tried to improve this by clarifying our website and by keeping close contact with the IRIO department, so we can continue giving introductory speeches during the introduction day. The reasons for signing up as a Clio member were divided between social and academic reasons. Moreover, the Bookstore was a big reason for people to sign up. Overall responses to the Bookstore were positive. We are pleased to see that both the membership fee and the introduction camp fee were seen as either adequate or cheap.

Verdict ClioWelcome Period

The questions on the ClioWelcome Period were filled in by all 30 respondents with the exceptions of the open questions, which were answered by around 20 respondents. Overall the ClioWelcome Period was seen as not too busy. However, based on the fact that the respondents also pointed out that they were too busy to attend more events, we would not recommend adding more activities. Most of the respondents went to the social activities such as the parties or the IIEL Support Lecture. Among which the parties were generally seen as the favourite activity. We are happy to see that most of the respondent felt included and welcomed as a freshman within Clio, both international as Dutch students.

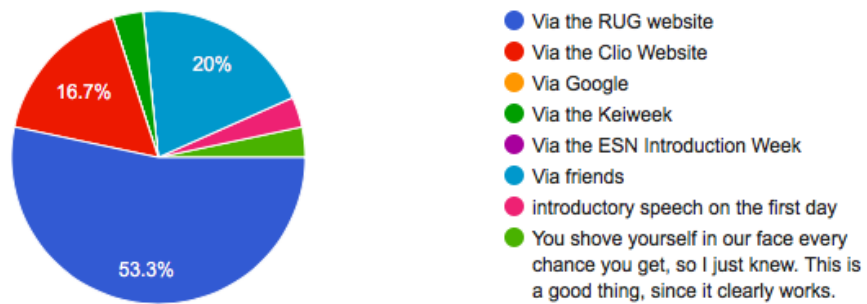
What type of Clio member are you currently?

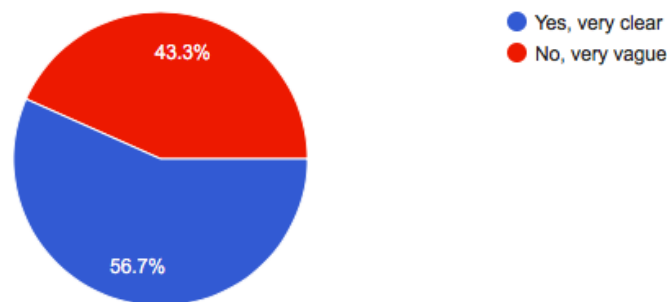
How did you find out about Clio as a Study Association?

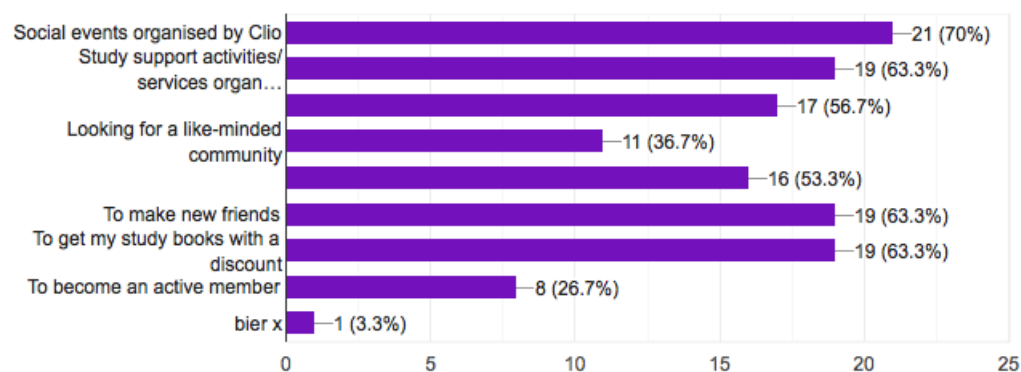
When joining as a member, was it clear to you what Clio is doing?

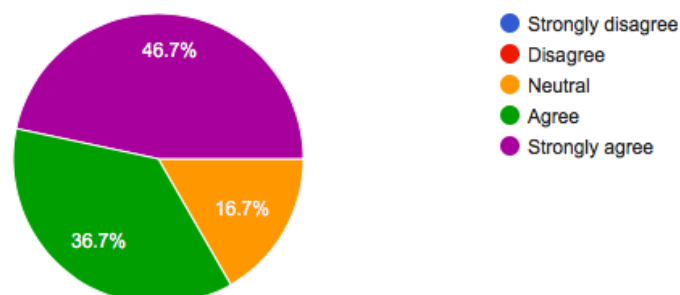
Why did you become a member of Clio (multiple options possible)

30 responses



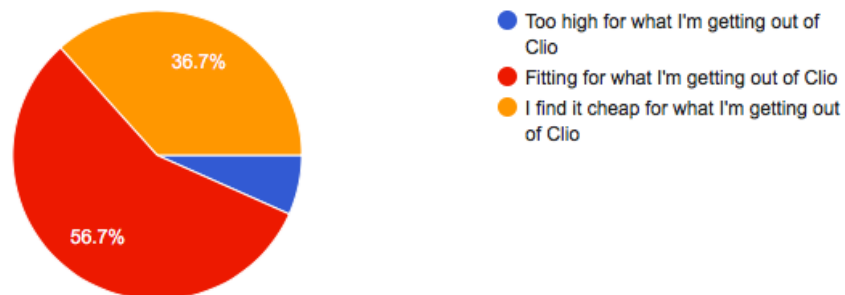
I am glad that I became a member of Clio

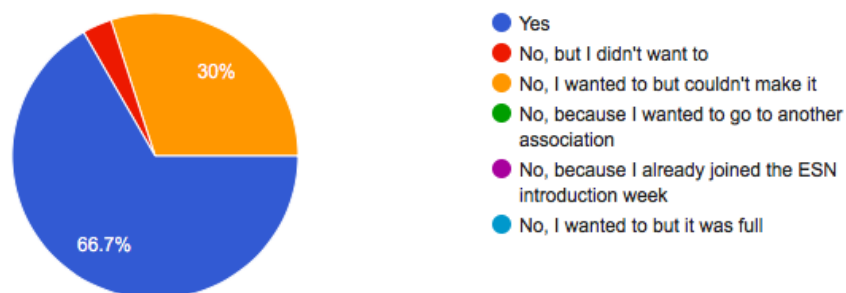
I think the membership fee of 17 euros per year is

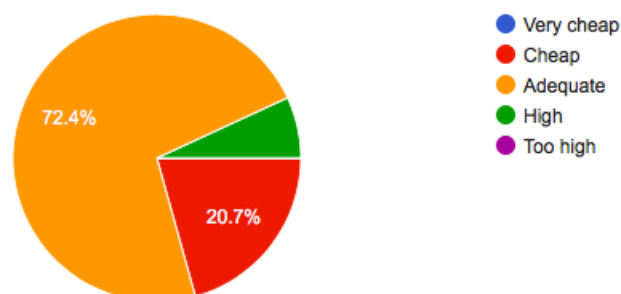
Did you go to the Clio introduction camp?

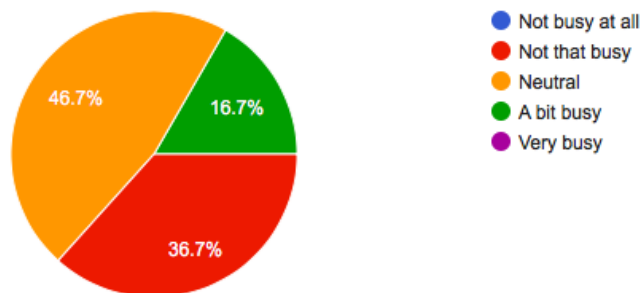

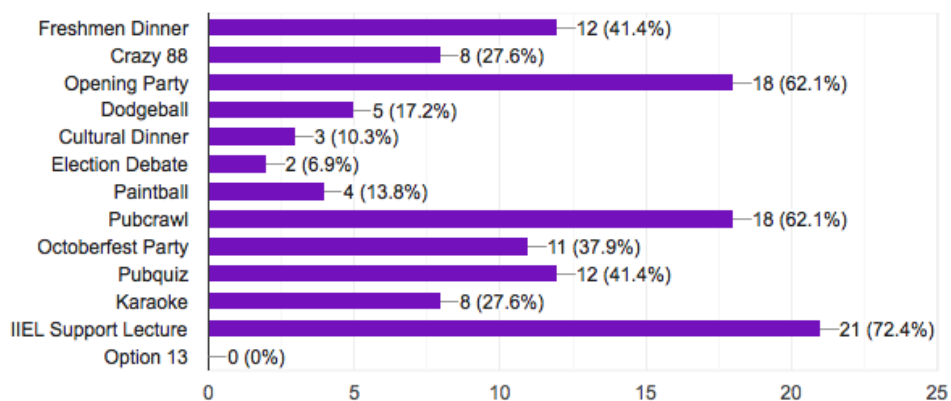
I found the Welcome Period in terms of number and intensity of the activities

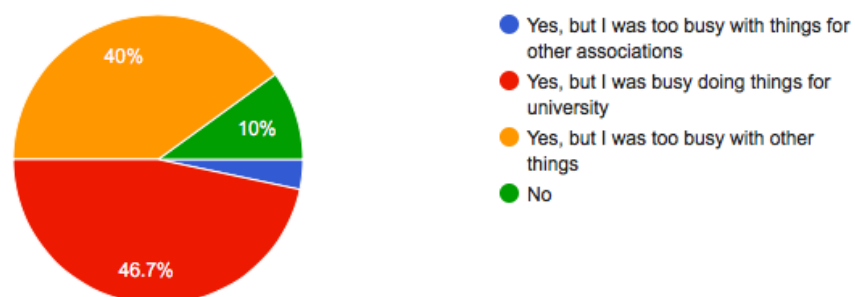
What was your least favorite ClioWelcome activity and why?

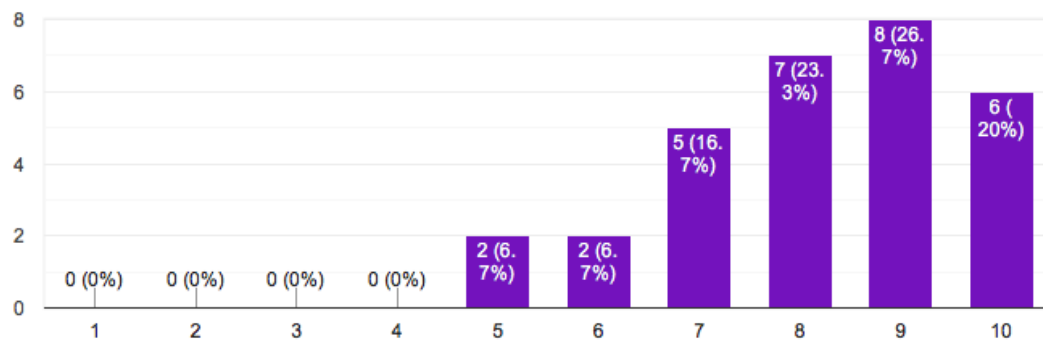

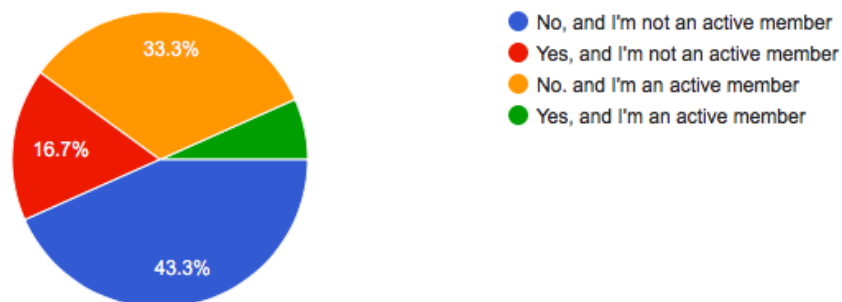
